Lori Wolff, Deputy Director of Health and Welfare is responsible for eligibility determination and enrollment of nearly 90,000 Idahoans into the Medicaid program. She will discuss how hospitals and nursing homes can prepare for this increased enrollment and demand on services.

Pharmaceutical supply chain strategies can be leveraged to improve organizational financial performance, physician, nurse and staff satisfaction and patient safety. Understanding key elements of purchasing, inventory optimization, and navigation of medication recalls and shortages, the medication supply chain can be better managed and developed into key initiatives. Senior leaders can greatly influence the strategic factors and decisions that serve as catalysts for improvement of drug supply chain management leading to enhanced efficiency, reduced waste, cost control and improvement in patient outcomes.
